FROM THE PASTOR

In his book, <u>Whistling in the Dark</u>, Frederick Buechner asks some questions that are good questions for each of us as we continue our Lenten journey:

"If you had to bet everything you have on whether there is a God or whether there isn't, which side would get your money and why?"

"When you look at your face in the mirror, what do you see in it that you most like and what do you see in it that you most deplore?"

"If you had only one last message to leave to the handful of people who are most important to you, what would it be in 25 words or less?"

"Of all the things you have done in your life, what is the one you would most like to undo? What is the one that makes you the happiest to remember?"

"Is there any person in the world, or any cause, that, if circumstances called for it, you would be willing to die for?"

"If this were the last day of your life, what would you do with it?"

We are now two weeks into Lent. Lent calls us to evaluate our relationship with God, to organize our priorities in our life. During this time in the church year, we need to as ourselves questions such as Buechner proposes and reflect upon our lives. We are called to repent of our sins so that the old Adam in us, the part of us that wishes to remain ignorant of God's grace, may be drowned (to borrow language from the Apostle Paul).

As we think about the events leading up to our Lord's suffering, crucifixion, and death, we cannot help thinking about our own mortality. But even amidst this season of ashes and dust, we know what lies ahead. We know that as the old Adam is drowned, we have hope of resurrection through the new Adam, Jesus Christ.

So, as you continue to journey through Lent, think about your life and dwell on the cross of Christ, rejoicing in the hope and mercy that is ours because of what Christ did for us.

Garfield Lutheran Church Council Meeting February 7, 2018

Garfield Lutheran Church Council met on February 7, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. Members present were Pastor Bruce Bringle, Becky Bjornson, Jim Connor, Cynthia Huse, Kevin Olson, Todd Patzer, Jeri Popma, and Gene Winkels.

Cynthia Huse was elected president and Jeri Popma was elected Vice President. President Huse then called the meeting to order. Pastor Bringle then led us with devotion and a prayer.

The Secretary, Financial Secretary, and Treasurer's reports were read and approved.

Pastor's Report: Midweek Christian Ed/ Church School program is proceeding along with a plan to start Wednesday, Feb. 21 and run every week till schools out in June. First Communion is set for March 29th at the Maundy Thursday service.

Garfield Church Women: No Report

Trustee Report: A) Weber's Construction will be starting work on the new bathroom and other updates at the parsonage shortly. There is a desk that needs to be moved from the parsonage to the church before that work can begin. The Trustees will take care of this.

Unfinished Business: A) A sexual misconduct policy needs to be written and approved by the Council before the additional insurance coverage can go into effect. Pastor Bringle and Cynthia Huse are working on this policy. The Synod and Insurance Company both recommend this additional coverage.

B) Garfield is looking for 2-3 people for a committee to take a look at the Constitution and By-Laws for Garfield and recommend changes and updates that need to be done. If interested in this project contact Pastor Bringle or Cynthia Huse.

C) 2-3 people are needed to help organize a midweek church school program until we get a Board of Education. If interested contact Pastor Bringle. A Board of Education is a requirement of our Constitution with its duties being spelled out in the Constitution and the By-Laws.

D) The Agape Singers will be holding a service at Garfield on March 11 at 4:00 pm. WELCA will serve a supper after the service. A motion was made, seconded, and approved that the church would pay for the meal with WELCA doing the serving.

New Business: A) Some old church records need to be sorted and organized. If interested in helping please contact Cynthia Huse. B) The Church Council will be installed at the Sunday Feb. 11 service.

The Garfield WELCA met Wednesday, February 14, 2018 at 2 p.m. in the church dining room. Eight members were present. President Lorraine called the meeting to order with a prayer. The theme verse was recited. We sang the theme hymn "I Love to Tell the Story". The Secretary and Treasurer's reports were read and approved. Mission Action reported that 8 ladies were present at the February Do-Day; they completed 26 quilts.

<u>Old Business:</u> -Soup and Pie Day plans were made. Our Annual Soup and Pie Day will be Wednesday, March 14 at the Madison VFW, serving from 11 a.m.-1 p.m. For this project to proceed successfully, we need all the help we can get.
