GARFIELD WELCA- Minutes for Garfield WELCA Meeting-9-11-19

The Garfield WELCA met on Wednesday, September 11th at 2:00p.m. at the church with Norma Armstrong and Carla Gritmacker at hostesses. Members present were Ramona Thompson, Lois Bjornson, Pat Haugen, Carla Gritmacker, Lorraine Connor, Lorna Johnson, and Norma Armstrong. The meeting was called to order by President, Lorraine Connor, followed by the opening prayer. The secretary was absent, so no secretary report was given. There was no correspondence. The Treasurer's report was read and put on file. Mission Action reported that at the August DoDay, we had 5 ladies attend, and made 23 quilts and packed several boxes for the Marie Sandvik Center.

For old business, thanks were given for bringing salads and working at our Salad supper. The treasurer's report indicated that no donations have been given to defray the cost of cleaning the church, so contributions were encouraged. The trip to the Eagles' Nest didn't happen, but maybe next year. Permission was given to bring our unused paint to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection at Dawson.

For new business, we were encouraged to attend the Fall Gathering at Granite Falls Lutheran Church on October 15, 2019. We'll get details later. We were told that the Fall Retreat will be held at Green Lake Bible Camp in December as a Christmas program. More details later. Our Thank-offering service is planned for Sunday, November 10th, and a discussion was held about plans for it. Barb Ludvigson is listed as the service planner. We will as Lois Sather to print our WELCA books if she is available. We decided not to have a Cookie Sale again this December, as will ask for donations, as we did last year. We discussed lunches at WELCA and Circle meetings, and it was suggested that we only serve one item, such as dessert and coffee, or a sandwich and a beverage, with a side of candy or nuts allowed.

The nominating committee presented a nomination sheet with no nominations for president, vice president, secretary, or nominating committee. Rosemary has agreed to continue as treasurer, and the Mission Growth, Mission Action and Mission Community people agreed to continue. A vote was not taken, and nothing was decided. What solutions can we come up with? Our offering was taken, and a prayer given.

Our program was presented. Norma gave devotions, using Bible verses about immigration. We then had a presentation about immigration presented by Lorraine. It included an article about how our ELCA is trying to help people deported back to their home country, working with Lutheran World Federation and CASM, a Mennonite organization. We also heard the paper written by Pastor Don McKee of Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Montevideo, as written in Pastor Bringle's Newsletter article about immigration and "Sanctuary Churches". We then made familiar with the "School Kit to Honduras" program by which children are helped with school supplies so they can attend school in Honduras, which may encourage their families to stay in their home country, rather than immigrating to another country. We then listened to "You'll Never Walk Alone" by Danny O'Donnell, with thoughts of immigrants "walking" to find a better life.

The meeting was adjourned, and we closed with The Lord's Prayer. A delicious lunch was served by Norma and Carla.

The Lac Qui Parle Church council met on Wednesday, September 11th at 7:00pm. Members present include: Pastor Bruce, John Dove, Sue Lund, Mark Roisen, Jeff Marotzke, Dallas Kelly, Gary Sigdahl, Lindee Olson, Tracy Dove, Jeff Kleven, and Rhoda Kleven. The meeting was called to order by President, John Dove. Pastor Bruce read devotions from Exodus 32:7-14 and Christ in Our Home. The agenda was review and approved with one addition: The 150th Anniversary Celebration. The August meeting minutes were reviewed and approved.

President's Report: Nothing to report.

<u>Financial Report</u>: May – July Financial reports were available for review. These were approved pending contingent audit review. Lindee Olson resigned as Church Treasurer. She will continue with these duties until the position can be filled.
