- You will also be ushered out, from the back to the front. The ushers will let you know when to leave. Please stay seated until they dismiss you.

One last thing: If you wish to visit with people following the service, you are asked not to visit inside the sanctuary, but to please wait until you are at least in the narthex or outside. Please observe at least 6 feet distance from the other person. Thank you!

Pastor is starting to make in-person communion visits again! He will try to set up some appointments, but if you want to call and set one up, that would be okay as well. For these next couple of months, Pastor will try to keep the visits down to 30 minutes or so.

Our Lenten services continue on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. Suppers will not be served this year. This Wednesday, we will meet at Garfield. The over-all main theme for the Lenten Season is "Places of the Passion". The place of the Passion will be the Courtyard, outside of where Jesus is put on trial before the high priest and where Peter denies Jesus. We are called to confess that we often tend to distance ourselves from Christ, when we should be drawing closer to him. The meaning, history and spiritual inspiration associated with the Courtyard help us to grow to understand more deeply the hard road our Lord took that the way to heaven might be open to us.
