CHILDREN'S SERMON

THE HOMILY CONTINUES

HYMN "Go to Dark Gethsemane" (vv.1,2) ELW 347

THE READING OF THE PASSION OF OUR LORD

(you may remain seated)

Narrator: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 15th chapter. As soon as it was morning the chief priests, with the elders and scribes, and the whole council held a consultation; and they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him to Pilate. And Pilate asked him,

North Side: Are you the King of Jews?

South Side: You have said so.

Narrator: And the chief priests accused him of many things, And Pilate asked him,

North Side: Have you no answer to make? See how many charges they bring against you.

Narrator: But Jesus made no further answer, so that Pilate wondered. Now at the feast, he used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called...

All: BARABBAS!

Narrator: And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he was told to do for them.

South Side: Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?

Narrator: For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them insead...

All: BARABBAS!

North Side: Then what shall I do with the man whom you call King of Jews?

All: CRUCIFY HIM! CRUCIFY HIM!

South Side: Why, what evil has he done?

All: CRUCIFY HIM!

Narrator: So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them

All: BARABBAS!

Narrator: And having scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified. And the soldiers led him away inside the palace-that is, the praetorium- and they called together the whole battalion. And they clothed him in a purple cloak, and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on him. And they began to salute him:

Men: Hail, King of Jews!

Narrator: And they stuck his head with a reed, and spat upon him, and they knelt down in homage to him. And when they had mocked him, they stripped him of the purple cloak, and put his own clothes on him. And they led him out to crucify him. And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross. And they brought him into the place called Golgotha- which means the place of a skull. And they offered him wine mingled with myrrh; but he did not take it. And they crucified him...and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. And it was the third hour, when they crucified him. And the inscription of the charge against him read,

North Side: The King of Jews.

Narrator: And with him they crucified two robbers, one on his right and one on his left. And those who passed by derided him, wagging their heads:

South Side: Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself!

Women: Come down from the cross!

Narrator: So also the chief priests mocked him to one another with the scribes:

North Side: He saved others; he cannot save himself.

South Side: Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross...

North Side: ...that we may see and believe.

Narrator: Those who were crucified with him also reviled him. And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness...over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice:

South Side: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Narrator: And some of the bystanders hearing it said,

Women: Behold, he is calling Elijah.

Narrator: And one ran and filling a sponge full of vinegar, put it on a reed and gave it to him to drink, saying,

North Side: Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down.

Narrator: And Jesus uttered a loud cry...and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that he thus breathed his last, he said,

Men: Truly this man was the Son of God!

Narrator: The Gospel of the Lord.

Pastor: At the foot of the cross, let us confess our sins to Almighty God.

Cong: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed. We deserve your wrath and punishment. But we who have caused Christ's death also take refuge in it. For his sake look upon us in love and continue to claim us as you forgiven children.

Pastor: May our heavenly Father grant us true repentance and the Holy Spirit's help to persevere in faith.
